

MINUTES
WAR MEMORIAL BOARD OF TRUSTEES
REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING

Thursday, August 9, 2001

The Board of Trustees of the War Memorial of San Francisco met in regular session at 2:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 9, 2001, in the Trustees' Board Room, War Memorial Opera House, President Horn presiding.

ROLL CALL

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

President Horn called for approval of the minutes of the July 12, 2001 regular meeting of the Board. On motion of Trustee Shultz, seconded by Trustee Haas, the minutes were unanimously approved.

MANAGING DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Rental Requests: Ms. Murray reported that rental requests as mailed to Trustees include two special event activities: 1) a request from the Goldman Environmental Prize Foundation for use of the Opera House on April 22, 2002, to host its annual prize ceremony and post-ceremony reception; and 2) a request from the San Francisco Symphony to install a tent in the Davies Symphony Hall parking lot from approximately August 31 through September 6, 2001, for its opening night pre-performance dinner on September 5, 2001. She noted that the Symphony also requests use of its one catering exemption for 2001-02 for opening night festivities. Ms. Murray stated that remaining rental requests are routine and requested their approval. On motion of Trustee Farrow, seconded by Trustee Shultz, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

Patina – New General Manager: Ms. Murray introduced Doug Rausenberger, new General Manager for Patina at the War Memorial and Performing Arts Center. She stated that Mr. Rausenberger was previously general manager at Ruth Chris' Steakhouse in San Francisco, and began working with Patina in Los Angeles in early July before assuming his new position here on July 30. Mr. Rausenberger thanked the Board of Trustees for the welcome extended to him.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Revenue, Appropriations and Building Projects Report for July 2001: Mr. Ridenour referred to the revenue, appropriations, and status of building projects reports for July 2001, and requested a resolution to approve July 2001 housekeeping expenditures as submitted. REGULAR ITEMS

Request of San Francisco Resource Faire 2001 - Veterans Building Exterior Banner: President Horn stated that Trustees have received a copy of the letter from Cheryl Cook, Planning Coordinator for the San Francisco Resource Faire 2001, requesting permission to display a banner on the exterior of the Veterans Building announcing the 2001 Resource Faire which will take place in the Veterans Building main lobby on Wednesday, October 3, 2001, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Ms. Cook has requested to display the banner for the week preceding the event, from September 26 through October 4, 2001. President Horn noted that this activity, organized by the County Veterans Service Office, was previously approved by the Trustees at the November 9, 2000 meeting.

Ms. Murray reported that the new banners for the exterior of the Veterans Building, approved by the Board several months ago, are close to completion and are expected to be installed in early September. She noted that the proposed Resource Faire banner will be installed over one of the new banners for the week preceding the Resource Faire. Following discussion, and on motion of Trustee Farrow and seconded by Trustee Haas, the following resolution was unanimously approved.

RESOLVED, By the Board of Trustees of the War Memorial of San Francisco that it hereby approves the request of the County Veterans Service Office to display a banner on the exterior of the Veterans Building from September 26 through October 4, 2001, announcing the 'San Francisco Resource Faire 2001' which will take place in the Veterans Building main lobby on October 3, 2001.
