REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING

Thursday, December 11, 2003

The Board of Trustees of the War Memorial of San Francisco met in regular session at 2:00 p.m. on Thursday, December 11, 2003, in the Trustees' Board Room, War Memorial Opera House, President Jarman presiding.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

President Jarman called for approval of the minutes of the November 13, 2003 regular meeting of the Board. On motion of Trustee Farrow, seconded by Trustee Shultz, the minutes were unanimously approved.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

<u>Mayor of San Francisco</u>: On behalf of the Board of Trustees, President Jarman commended and thanked Willie L. Brown, Jr. for his eight years as Mayor of the City and County of San Francisco. President Jarman stated that during his two terms, Mayor Brown has overseen the development, improvement and growth of San Francisco, and has established extraordinarily high standards, which will benefit the City for years to come.

President Jarman extended congratulations and best wishes to Mayor-elect Gavin Newsom, who has already made significant contributions to the City as a member of the Board of Supervisors, and whose dedication, skill and leadership is certain to enhance and strengthen the future of San Francisco.

<u>War Memorial Budget for FY 2004-05</u>: President Jarman reported that City department budget requests for the next fiscal year must be submitted to the Controller's Office by mid-February 2004.
